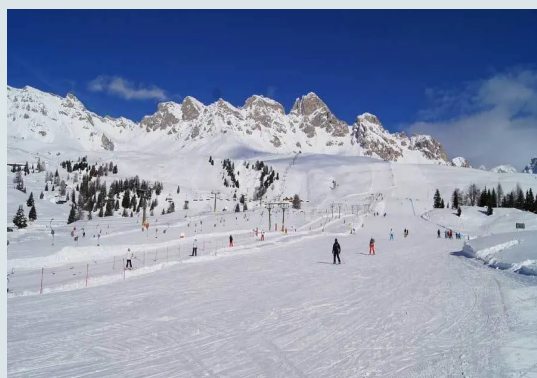




Canazei is part of the extensive Dolomite ski area, allowing skiers of all abilities to enjoy Italy's varied terrain and beautiful landscapes. Another factor drawing winter sports enthusiasts to this resort is its convenient location on the renowned Sella Ronda ski circuit. Top Runs

- Advanced skiers can enjoy the resort's black runs and off-piste trails. Visitors have easy access to 1,200km of runs in the Dolomite ski area, boasting challenging and varied terrain.
- For intermediates, there are a variety of red runs throughout Canazei and the rest of the Dolomite ski area, specifically the Sella Ronda circuit.
- Beginners can find gentle blue slopes towards the bottom of the valley and progress to more challenging runs further up the mountain.



Best for Après Ski

- **Rosengarten**
Live music and DJ sets are an essential element of this bar, alongside craft beers and an extensive cocktail list.
- **Paradis**
This lively bar is a mecca for après ski lovers. Enjoy sing along music, table dancing and a vast choice of drinks.
- **Osteria**
This historical building, located at the bottom of the slopes, is popular for its friendly atmosphere and selection of après ski drinks.

Recommended Restaurants

- **El Pael Ristorante**
A rustic tavern serving Trentino-region antipasti, pasta, and meat dishes. Well known for its selection of northern Italy wines.
- **L'Ostaria da Besic**
Famed for its delicious, homemade pizzas, this traditional Alpine pizzeria is a popular food spot in Canazei.
- **El Resolè**
An all-round Italian dining experience, from staff dressed in traditional clothing to classic Alpine interior and delicious Italian food.
