



Corvara is a fantastic alternative as base on the Sella Ronda circuit in Italy. Corvara is a pleasant, lively village with a lovely traditional centre that is very family friendly. Its local slopes suit novices, but also provide a great base for adventurous experts and intermediates looking to explore the Sella Ronda. Part of the Alta Badia region, the skiing is fantastic and picturesque. The area as a whole is brilliant for all types of skier or snowboarder.

Top Runs

- For intermediates there's a vast network of slopes ideal for cruising and confidence-boosting. The red back to Corvara underneath the Boe cable car is excellent, it's usually uncrowded and retains good snow.
- The area around Corvara and Colfosco is excellent for novices, with great nursery slopes and lots of easy runs to progress to.
- For experts, the much longer wooded runs down to La Villa include a black run, which can be tricky when icy. Or you can whizz off towards Selva or Arabba on the Sella Ronda circuit.



Best for Après Ski

- **L'Murin**
A renovated old mill house opposite Hotel La Perla in Corvara with a wonderfully cosy, rustic setting.
- **L'Got**
This is a stylish cosy bar, which serves great cocktails and tasty bar snacks.
- **The Iceberg Lounge Bar**
Located at the Hotel Col Alto, this is highly regarded as the best place to drink cocktails and enjoy the relaxing sunset in Corvara.

Recommended Restaurants

- **La Stüa de Michil**
A fantastic restaurant in Hotel La Perla with a Michelin star, serving up superb food in a warm atmosphere in Corvara.
- **La Fornella**
Excellent pizza in Corvara at great value. A highly recommended choice.
- **Black Hill**
This is a popular choice for some delicious, wood-fired pizza in Corvara.
- **L'Osti**
This restaurant has taken traditional Italian dishes and given them a modern twist. It also has a fantastic wine list.
