Our View on Flaine





Flaine is known for its Bauhaus-inspired buildings and monumental outdoor sculptures by Picasso; a ski resort like no other. This town is part of the Grand Massif ski area, one of the largest ski regions in France. As a result, there's a wealth of opportunities for skiers here, especially when most accommodation is skiin ski-out. You could almost ski up to your doorstep in most places to stay here. The slopes have a massive variety of difficulties, so any skier will be able to find the right challenge for them.

Top Runs

- For advanced beginners, the Mélèze green slope is uniform and safe, which allows those who are new to skiing to find their speed easily. Although a small challenge for beginners, this run can help inspire confidence.
- The blue Méphisto is a firm favourite in the region. This wide-open run heads straight towards the centre of Flaine. With a tree-lined section, the landscape and terrain are varied.
- Les Cascades is the longest run in the region at 14km and an elevation of 1,700m. Although quite long, this easy run leads from Flaine to Sixt.



Best for Après Ski

- Le White Pub Your classic alpine pub, expect a friendly service and a great atmosphere.
- **1967** Children can enjoy pancakes and desserts from 3.30pm whilst you relax with some mulled wine!
- Le Pointe Noire
 This bar and restaurant
 provides tasty drinks and
 delicious dishes. Sit back with
 an aperitif whilst enjoying
 classic, yet modern French
 cuisine at its finest.
- Auberge de Vernant This cosy bar is decorated with traditional alpine touches, creating a charming and homely feel to the place.

Recommended Restaurants

• Sabaudia

This small restaurant tucked away from the main street offers the best of traditional alpine cuisine. The fondue is a real showstopper, and the hearty food is sure to warm you up. Book in advance as this hidden gem fills up quickly.

- La Pente à Jules A great après spot, the terrace has an idyllic location overlooking the slopes. Order a burger and fries and watch the skiers race past as you drink a delicious vin chaud.
- Restaurant les Covagnes Found at the bottom of the ski resort, the sunny terrace is a great way to soak up the rays. Its prime location means you couldn't be any closer to the slopes.
- Le Grain de Sel With a lovely view of Les Platieres and a great terrace, this restaurant is a top choice. The children's area nearby means that kids can go off and play whilst parents are close by.
