Our View on Méribel





Méribel in France is found in the Les Allues Valley at the centre of the world's largest ski area, Les Trois Vallées, giving access to more than 600km of piste and unlimited off-piste. Méribel Valley, the resort's local area, has around 150km of piste in its own right (the majority blue, plus around 25% red and under 10% green or black). The resort's lasting popularity is due not only to its extensive skiing, but also to its attractive chalet-style architecture and overall Alpine charm.

Top Runs

- Méribel has two designated beginner ski areas located in the centre of Méribel Mottaret and at the Altiport area as well.
- Combe du Vallon 1,000 vertical metres red run (almost black) down from the 2,950m top of the Mont Vallon telecabine, the red runs under the Cote Brune chairlift and La Face piste, which was the Women's Downhill course in the 1992 Winter Olympics.
- The Burgin telecabine runs up to the Saulire summit (2,739m) where the slopes are almost always in perfect condition.
- The Tougnete telecabine takes you up to 2,434m, from where you can ski either towards Les Menuires and Val Thorens or towards the pretty old village of Saint-Martin-de-Belleville, which is an ideal lunch spot.





Best for Après Ski

• Le Rond Point

Popular haunt located above the town of Méribel. Live music every night, also offers a fantastic restaurant. Expect singing, dancing and crowd surfing in ski boots in this funfilled hangout.

Jacks Bar

Famous for its friendly staff and fun atmosphere with live music, jugs of beer, cocktails, tasty pizzas and more.

Doron Pub

The biggest and liveliest bar in town with a huge party atmosphere. Live bands playing seven nights a week.

Sully's

Keep the party going until the early hours alongside some UK and international DJs.

Recommended Restaurants

La Taverne

The cosy bistro is known for its traditional Savoyard dishes and modern daily specials. From burgers to fondues and good wine – you can be sure it won't disappoint.

Le Blanchot Méribel

One of the finest restaurants in the Méribel valley, in a beautiful setting by the Altiport. Delicious gourmet food that makes for a lovely treat on a snowy night when the log fire is roaring.

• The Den

A smokehouse restaurant with a love of all things BBQ and beer. Locally sourced, slow-cooked – arguably the best meat in the resort.

Le Rastro

Fabulous traditional French food and a lively aprés scene when you've finished on the slopes for the day.
