



Montgenèvre is a small resort in the south-east of France. A family friendly resort, it's well known for its charm and sunshine. It's one of the sunniest ski resorts and has a good snow record thanks to its position catching snow from any wind direction. The resort has 60km of pistes with runs for every ability. There are even piste links to the Italian ski resorts of Sansicario, Sestriere, and Sauze d'Oulx. This gives the resort a mix of French and Italian culture, very much reflected in the food.

Top Runs

- **Le Bois** – A relatively flat green run, this piste is perfect for beginners. For other abilities, this slope is a great connecting run to the station.
- **L'office** – A red run, L'office is not overcrowded, starting steep before it flattens out and then descending again with moguls.
- **Le Chauvet** – Another red, this run is connected to L'office. It too starts steep and then connects with the slalom that ends at the village.



Best for Après Ski

- **Le Graal**
Right in the village centre, expect a lively atmosphere and TVs showing sport in this bar. Every week they have themed nights, making it one of the best for après.
- **U Cintu**
Parfaits, crêpes and more await you at U Cintu. Plenty of choice and good hospitality for all the family.
- **Le Refuge**
Boasting a lovely terrace for a snack break, this is a great après spot for foodies and cheese lovers.

Recommended Restaurants

- **Les Terrasses de Montgenèvre**
The definition of dinner with a view, this restaurant in the mountains has a friendly atmosphere, and food just as lovely as the scenery.
- **Le Trio**
For a cosier dining experience, Le Trio is perfect. A small restaurant, expect a warm ambience and delicious traditional French food.
- **Isabel**
One of the few restaurants offering a late dinner, they're well known for high quality meals. Their delicious food is quintessential Alpine Italian.
