



Saas Fee is fully deserving of its nickname, 'the pearl of the Alps', surrounded by 14 stunning peaks. This charming, Swiss resort arguably has some of the most dramatic scenery of anywhere in the Alps, and the town itself is made up of beautiful old wooden chalets. The resort is car free and easy to navigate on foot, however, there are also electric buses and taxis to take you around the town.

Top Runs

- For beginners, Saas Fee is a great starting point thanks to its large out-of-the-way nursery slope and relaxed blues.
- The wide, well-groomed pistes are great for snowboarders to carve up, and the lifts are ideal too, with access provided by gondolas, cable cars and t-bar lifts.
- Intermediates, who enjoy long cruises, will feel at home in Saas Fee. Start at Allalin and make your way down the mountain on the gentle red and blue slopes on offer.



Best for Après Ski

- **Steinbock Bar**
If you're after a quiet drink in Saas Fee, Steinbock Bar is the answer. Located centrally in the resort centre next to the church, make sure to book ahead as this bar has limited capacity and is very popular.
- **Black Bull Snowbar**
With a buzzing terrace and a cosy wooden hut, the party at Black Bull goes on until about seven in the evening. Perfect for a post-ski dance.
- **Nesti's Ski Bar**
Always a popular choice, this lively bar can be found underneath Hotel Christiania. Pop in after a day skiing on the mountain for a delicious Spiced Glühwein.
- **Poison**
If you're looking for shots and dancing until the early hours, head over to Poison.

Recommended Restaurants

- **Waldhotel Fletschhorn**
Foodies should head to the Michelin-starred establishment to be treated to some gastronomic delights and first-class service.
- **Waldhüs Bodmen**
With comfortable seating and great views from the terrace, Waldhüs Bodmen is a firm favourite thanks to its varied menu offering great food.
- **Don Ciccio**
Serving authentic Italian food, this friendly restaurant is a great place for families. Popular amongst locals and tourists, we advise that you book ahead.
- **The Vieux Chalet**
If you're after some traditional alpine fare, The Vieux Chalet is for you. The menu features more than 20 homemade cheese fondues in addition to raclette, rosti and other mountain favourites.
