
Our View on Selva Gardena





Selva Gardena is a skier's paradise in Italy offering both an

unbeatable quantity and variety of skiing, with direct access to the largest ski area in Europe – the Dolomiti Superski. The resort benefits from a fantastic lift system that whisks you up the mountain to the well-groomed slopes. Once up there, you have a range of wide open pistes or wonderful wooded reds to choose from. The village itself is a long roadside affair, with a traditional feel to it. Selva Gardena is relaxed, civilised and family friendly.

Top Runs

- There is a huge amount of skiing on offer here; the Dolomiti Superski pass covers not only Selva and the Sella Ronda resorts, but many others too.
- Competent intermediates will enjoy the Dantercepies area due to its lovely long reds that once made up the Woman's Downhill run. The black runs that make up Ciampinoi are also well worth a go, however, more timid intermediates may find these too steep and crowded.
- Cross-country skiers are very well catered for with 115km of trails, all of which enjoy jaw-dropping views. The trail up Vallunga-Langental is particularly beautiful and comes highly recommended.
- The nursery slopes are spacious and are kept in a great condition, located in Plan De Gralba and Alpe di Suisi, just a bus ride away.





Best for Après Ski

• La Stua

At the base of the mountain you'll find La Stua, a popular last spot for skiers, this warm and welcoming bar livens up in the evening, with live music and well-priced drinks.

• Hotel Sochers The hotel bar is a good spot for a quiet drink and a bite to eat at the end of the day.

Luislkeller

Found on the Sella Ronda, guests can enjoy a variety of drinks and snacks, as well as DJs, until the early hours.

Recommended Restaurants

Grillstube

Located inside Hotel Armin, this cosy, cellar restaurant offers an inexpensive menu featuring specialties from the barbecue as well as traditional dishes.

- Sal Fëur
 In the Garni Broi, Sal Fëur serves up brilliant pizzas from their wood-fire oven alongside some more traditional dishes. Dine on the terrace for magical views of the Dolomites.
- La Bula
 This family-run Italian
 restaurant is known for
 serving up excellent pasta
 and pizza. It is so popular, we
 recommend booking ahead
 as it can get busy.
- Ristorante Costabella
 This cosy restaurant serves
 up brilliant pizzas and
 traditional Tyrolean dishes.

 reviews, this place comes
 highly recommended.
