Our View on St. Moritz





St. Moritz ski resort is a truly magical destination, with a fantastic position in Switzerland's Engadine Valley. The location boasts magnificent views of the region, which is separated into three villages, Dorf, Lake St. Moritz and St. Moritz Bad. All three villages have direct lifts to the core skiing area, Corviglia, at 2,486m. St. Moritz not only has stunning scenery, but excellent skiing, with a total ski area of 325km. Be spoilt by the dazzling lakes, charming forests, and beautiful resort centre.

Top Runs

- Beginners have a dedicated area to progress in Corviglia. There are plenty of blue runs here to progress turns.
- From Corviglia take the gondola up to Piz Nair for remarkable views of the surrounding region. Then take the challenging 16 red slope and traverse across the mountain.
- Take the Signal chairlift from St. Moritz Bad to test your slalom skills on the women's World Cup Downhill slope.
- From St. Moritz Dorf, take the funicular up the mountain and from Corviglia, take the black slope to Chantarella for challenging tree-lined slope.

- Sternbar Marguns
 Located at 2,728 metres,
 Sternbar Marguns is an
 outdoor bar with a great
 atmosphere and the ultimate
 spot on a sunny day.
- Hossa Bar
 Sit back and relax on the large
 sun terrace with a beer. The
 bar gets particularly lively on
 Friday for the 'snow night'.
- King's Social Club
 For a sophisticated evening, head to King's Social Club.

Recommended Restaurants

- Trutz
 - A superb mountain restaurant overlooking the Upper Engadine lake landscape. It is directly next to the Suvretta lift station and accessible on foot. A great choice for a delicious home-cooked meal.
- Experience culinary excellence from a longtime dedicated Michelinstarred chef. Be seated inside a delightful Engadine farmhouse dating from 1658.
- For a cosy and homely meal, visit Kuhstall, on the valley run to Sils. The restaurant is in a transformed cowshed, serving warming traditional dishes.
